

# Mr. Burdick's Classroom Social Contract

We the students of Room E-104, come together to make our classroom a fun, safe learning environment for whoever enters it. We wrote down the following rules, expectations and promise to follow them in order to establish a safe learning environment.

## Article 1: Non-Negotiable School Rules

- Please clear off your workspace before leaving the classroom.

## Article 2: Classroom Rules

- We promise to follow the Golden Rule by treating others the way we want to be treated.
- In class, we promise to listen and give our undivided attention when our teacher or whomever is talking and be on task with our in-class assignments and homework so that we do not distract those around us who are leaning.

## Article 3: Classroom Responsibilities

- We will treat each other with respect.
- We are responsible for completing our homework when it is assigned and turning in the homework on time.
- We are expected to come prepared to class in order to learn. We will bring a pencils, textbook, binder, and homework to each class period.
